


Dedicated to the individuals who have donated their bodies to Mayo Foundation for anatomical study so that others might live.

Mayo Clinic burial vault is located at Oakwood Cemetery

38 Seventh Avenue NE, Rochester, Minnesota

- From the convocation (Mayo Civic Center), take First Avenue SE (north) to East Center Street
- Turn right (east) onto East Center Street
- Turn left (north) onto Seventh Avenue NE
- Oakwood Cemetery will be straight ahead approximately two blocks
- The vaults are approximately 50 yards west of the entrance of the cemetery and can be found by taking an immediate left inside the main gate.
