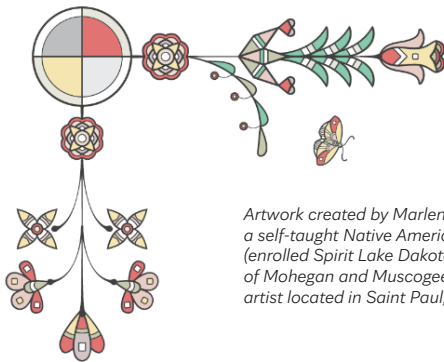




STUDY PARTICIPATION OPPORTUNITY
