

I am going to visit the Mayo Clinic.


















I will go to the lobby, check in and wait for my name to be called. I can watch the T.V., read, or play quietly.

















The doctor's helper will call my name and will get my height, weight and blood pressure.


















I will wait in a room until the doctor comes.

I may to go to audiology to get my hearing checked. They use very special headphones so kids can hear lots of different sounds.




















The Audiologist has special tools to make sure my ears are working. I might get to play a game with toy frogs.
