ABOUT THE STUDY

What is the purpose of the Tapestry 2.0 Study?

We're diving deep into how environmental exposures and a person's unique biological makeup collectively interact to impact health.

We will study not only DNA but also multiomics that reveal traces of environmental effects to better understand the complexity of why a disease or disorder occurs and how it progresses over time.

This knowledge could transform future discoveries and someday prevent diseases before they start, diagnose conditions more accurately and treat illnesses with precision medicine approaches

WHAT IS INVOLVED IN THIS STUDY?

You will be asked to provide a blood sample that will be collected at a Mayo Clinic location or using a remote blood draw company.

In addition, you will be asked to collect urine, stool, and saliva samples at your house, with paid packaging provided to return them to us.

You may also be asked to answer optional surveys and to use a mobile app to provide information.

WHO MAY JOIN THE TAPESTRY STUDY?

As we define sets of complex diseases to study, we are inviting participants a few at a time.

You may be invited to join Tapestry 2.0 if you:

- are 18 yrs. of age or older
- are a current Mayo Clinic patient
- have access to E-mail and internet services

Participation in the first Tapestry study is not a requirement to participate in Tapestry 2.0.

BENEFITS

Will I receive any testing results as part of the study?

In most cases you won't get test results because this is a research study.

But if a **rare** finding might affect your health or your family's health, the study team will contact you. You can choose whether to be given this information. If you decide to follow up on the information you receive and more medical testing or care is needed, you or your insurance will be responsible for those costs.

Will my Mayo Clinic electronic health record include test results from the Tapestry 2.0 research study?


No. The study team won't enter the test results into your Mayo Clinic electronic health record.

Is there Compensation for Participation?

There are no costs to you for being in the study. You will receive \$10 for each study sample type you complete (i.e., blood, urine, stool, saliva).

What are the benefits of participating in this study?

This study isn't about your personal healthcare — it's about working toward a healthier future for generations to come.



The goal of the study is to gather information for future research. You will not directly benefit from participation. Other people may benefit in the future from what we learn in this research study.

As the Mayo Brothers once said, "**The success of the Clinic, past, present and future, must be measured largely by its contributions to the general good of humanity.**" This is what we intend to do.
