Course Learning Objectives

At the conclusion of this program, the participant will be able to:

- Utilize new approaches to the diagnosis and understanding of behavioral disorders in the elderly.
- Apply a team approach to patients with nursing acquired infections.
- Advise patients on the best options regarding exercise training.
- Apply new knowledge to select drug therapy.
- Identify treatable conditions and intervene in movement disorders.
- Evaluate patients with syncope and other cardiac disease.
- Implement palliative care practices into (the spectrum of) geriatric practice settings.

Intended Audience

This course is designed for primary care physicians including family practitioners, internists, general practitioners, advanced nurse practitioners and physician assistants.

Credit
